Spring Term has begun and we have been delighted to offer so many enriching experiences already. Young Voices was a big success and children and parents commented on how enjoyable the experience was. Reception Class – Inkpen

Welcome back to school! We hope you all had a fabulous Christmas and wish you a happy new year. This term we will be learning all about the Chinese new year and look forward to flying to China on 31st January – make sure you have your passports and boarding passes ready!

We have been reading the 'Zodiac Rankings Race' and learning what ordinal numbers are in Maths. We then held our own races in the KS1 playground and used ordinal numbers to describe the positions everyone came in. Also, in maths, we have continued to learn the names of 2D and 3D shapes and practise combining 2D shapes together to make new shapes.

We are currently constructing a really long, colourful dragon, using dark and light shades of a chosen colour. We are learning to recognise that the shade of a colour becomes lighter when more white is added.

In phonics, we are reviewing all of set one sounds and starting to learn our set two sounds. We are trying very hard to now read words using 'Fred in our Head' as this will help us to read with a quicker pace and more fluency.





Class 1 - Donaldson


Happy New Year! We are pleased to see all of Year 1 back in school; ready and willing to learn.

In English lessons, we have explored the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'. We learnt what a question is and how to write it as a sentence using a question mark. We then thought of questions we could ask about this fairy tale.

After this, we looked at a similar story called 'The Three Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig' by Eugene Trivizas. We thought this story was very funny! We found similarities between the two stories and told each other what we liked and did not like about this alternate story. We retold the story by acting it out. We used hot seating, which is questioning a character about his or her background, behaviour and motivation to develop our questioning and listening skills in an engaging way. We took turns to be the characters. We will now use this story to inspire our own writing.


Our new book in English is 'Traction Man' and we are starting to write superhero stories based on ideas we have read in this brilliant book.


<u>Class 3 - Jamila</u>

In science, we started our topic on rocks and tested different rocks for density, durability and to see if they were porous. We also found out about the 3 different categories of rocks. We cannot wait to find out more about fossils and volcanoes.

This is has been linked with our history topic about The Romans through which we have found out about slaves and gladiators. During History, we become archaeologists to help build the picture as to how we know The Romans built temples in England due to their religious beliefs of believing in more than one god. We also transformed ourselves into particles during science to show the difference between solids, liquids and gases.

Class 5 – Rowling


