Dear Parents, Carers and Children

As we come to the end of the term, we can celebrate in our many successes, thoughtful actions and our strong partnerships. Teachers are finding many opportunities to work outside and this will continue next term. During play times and lunch times children are being encouraged to be active and we have increased the amount of equipment available to them.

During the last couple of weeks in Reception, we have been super busy continuing learning more of our letter sounds and learning how to blend them to read and write words. This is a really tricky skill but we have tried really hard and are making good progress with this. We are starting to include some independent writing into our play, which has been amazing to see! In maths, we have learnt what a repeating pattern is and have made our own through rhymes, music and by using objects. We have been developing our drawing skills by doing some pen observational work of some of the food that has been kindly donated for Harvest. We will be using water colour paints to wash over our pen work. The children have loved logging onto Purple Mash and using the mouse pad to manipulate the cursor around the screen to complete some online games!





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Class Jamila -Class 3



Despite an unsettled week, our learning has continued as normal and included Ukulele lessons and basketball too.








<u>Class Morpurgo – Class 4</u>









Class Rowling - Class 5
