Reception


In Reception all children will learn how to:


- Say the sounds
- Fred talk and sound blend to read words
- Write the sounds down individually and later to write words.

The RWI programme is split into 3 phases - or sets. Set 1 and 2 are taught in our Reception classroom, details of which are below. We use cards to link the sound with a picture and a rhyme or 'memory sentence'. These cards are available for parents to purchase for home use. Please ask Mrs Lawson or Mrs Jorgensen for details.









Pure Sounds

We pronounce each letter sound using **pure sounds** ('mmmm' not' muh', 'ssss' not 'suh', etc.) Here is a link so you can hear these sounds. We strongly recommend watching this video as it is very important that we are all saying the sounds in the same way:

Using pure sounds helps the children not only when sound-blending to hear the word, but also with spelling.

Fred Talk



At school we use a puppet called Fred who is an expert on sounding out words. We call it 'Fred Talk'. E.g. m-o-p, c-a-t, m-a-n, sh-o-p, b-l-a-ck.

Set 1 Sounds are taught in the following order together with rhymes to help children form the letters correctly and instantly recognise sounds ready for blending.

<u>Please do not use letter names (capital letters) at this early stage.</u>

<u>Step 2:</u>

The children are then taught **Set 2 Sounds** - the long vowels, which all contain 'special friends,' (2 or 3 letters that combine together to make 1 sound).

Reading books

Your child will be offered a book from the very beginning of Reception. The first books that come home are wordless. These books can be used to tell a story through the pictures and gives your child their first experience of bringing home a book in their book bag, looking after it at home and bringing it back to school each day. When the first sounds have been taught your child will receive books with simple decodable words to read alongside the pictures. Once your child is successfully reading single words using Fred talk and sound blending, they will be introduced to 'RWI Ditty books'. Children use sound-blending (Fred Talk) to read short ditties. Your child will bring these home once they have read and discussed the book in class.

Within all the books children will have **red** and **green** words to learn to help them to become speedy readers. **Red** words - often referred to at Braunston as 'rotten red words' are words that are not phonically decodable and don't stick to the phonics rules, so can't be sound-blended to work them out. Examples of these are: said, you, was. **Green** words are linked to the sounds they have been learning and are easily decodable.

Word Packs

Once your child has been introduced and taught these words in school we will send them home for you to continue practising with your child. This is an important part of developing Reception children's reading skills at Braunston and word packs should be practised regularly alongside reading books at home.

Order of Story books: Children will hopefully follow the order listed below. The expectation is that all children will leave Reception as confident speedy readers, ready to take on the challenges of Year 1. However, some children may need extra support and your teacher will talk to you about this.
