Class Ahlberg -Class 2

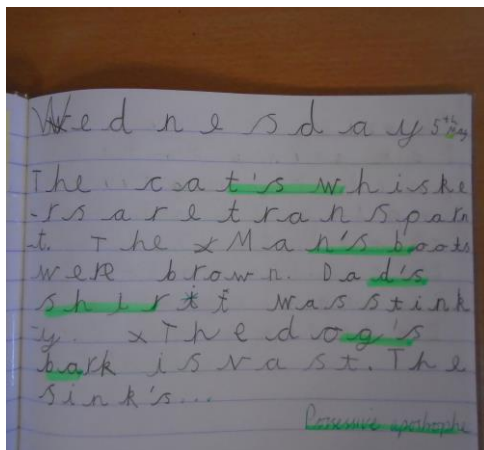

Class Horowitz - Class 6

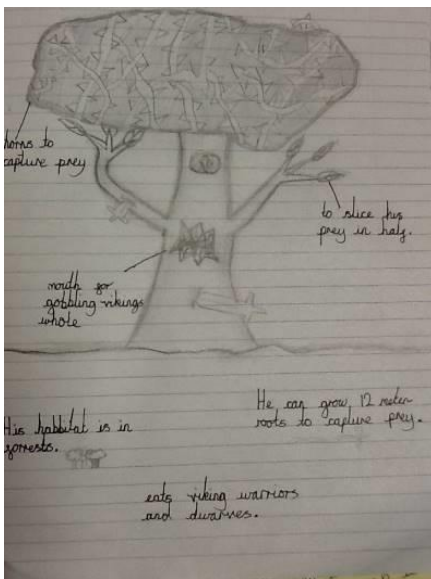
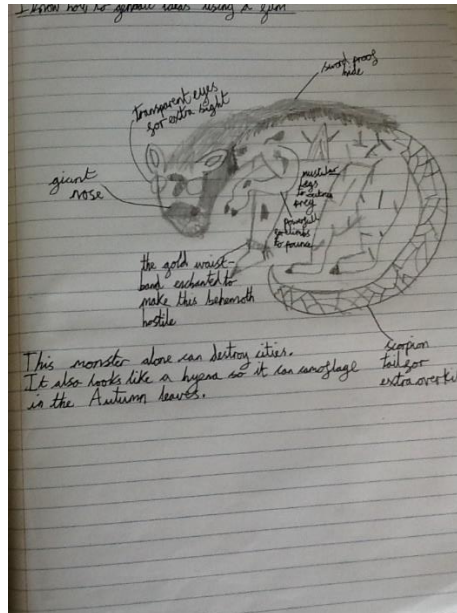
What a busy two weeks Horowitz class have had!

FOREST SCHOOL

Group A of Year 6 have enjoyed two days of some brand new activities at Forest School. We visited Jetty Fields where we split in to two teams and laid trails and went on a treasure hunt where we found hot chocolate and biscuits. The children made a shelter using tarpaulins and rope. We had lunch in the Forest School area and we made tree faces from mud and natural materials. We dissected owl pellets and found a huge amount of skulls and different bones from rodents. We made clay tiles using natural materials to make our designs and we also lit the storm kettles and firepit to boil water and toast marshmallows and enjoyed hot chocolate and biscuits.



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
