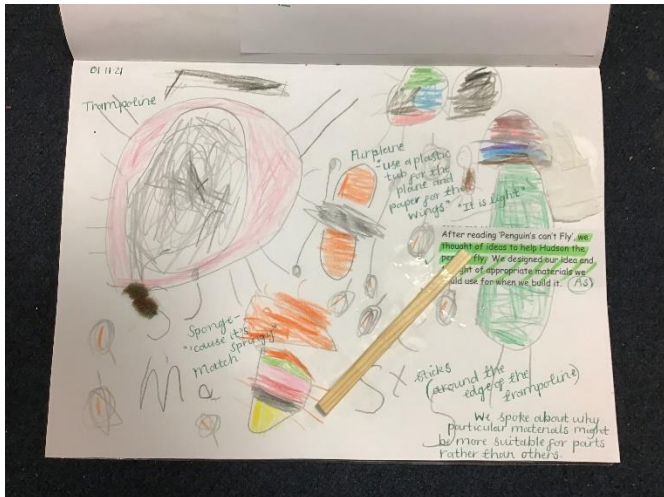

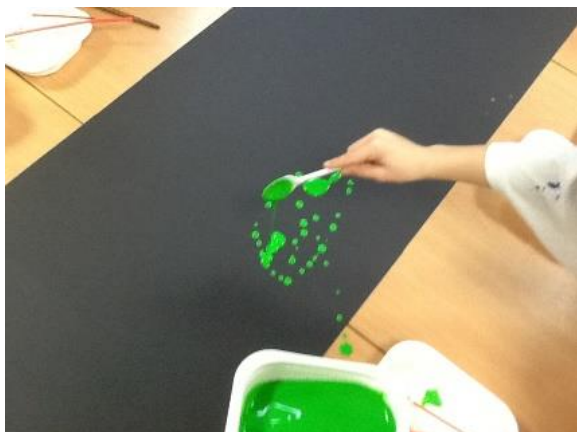

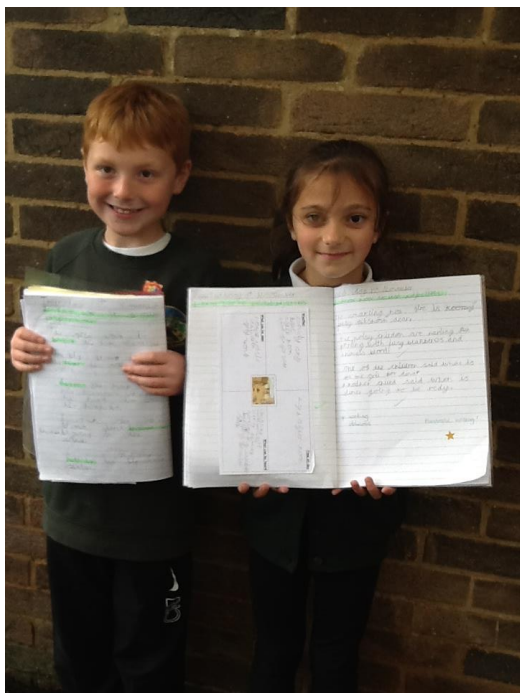
Class Jamila -Class 3

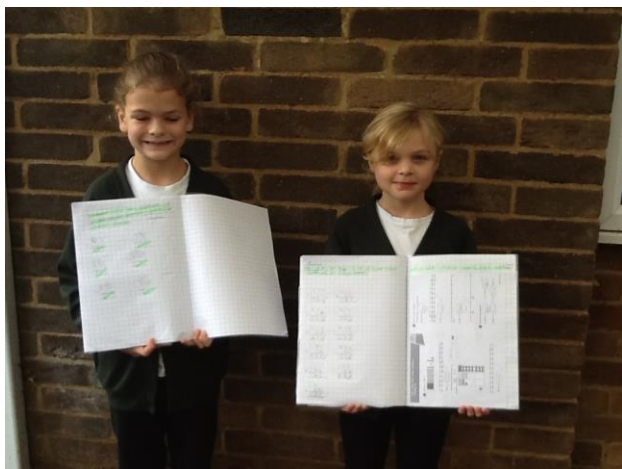
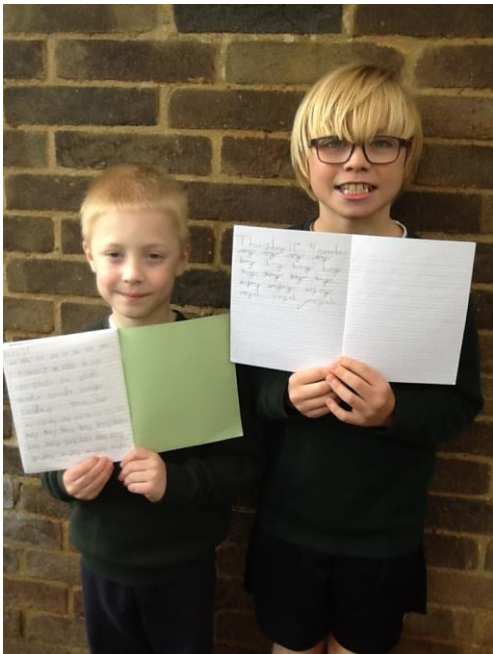

Class Morpurgo – Class 4

For our science topic in Morpurgo class this term we are looking at teeth and digestion. We began by looking at our own teeth and noticed that they are not all the same. Some are sharp and good for biting and others we use for chewing.

Light can be produced from many different sources such as torches, candles, the sun and lamps.

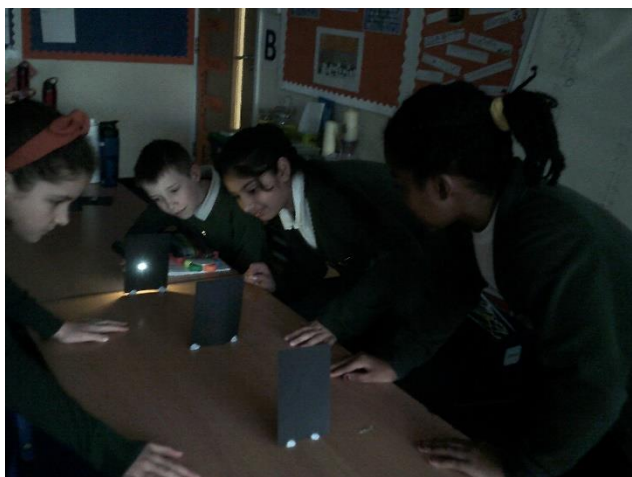
