Dear Parents and Carers,

Spring Term has begun in earnest, despite the cold and dark mornings; we can see new growth springing up throughout our school grounds. You can see what children are learning in the topic webs found on our website. Please continue to talk about the school day with your child and discover what they are learning. The curriculum has changed so much and you will be amazed by the knowledge and skills that children are acquiring.

We are aware that some children are coming into school without eating breakfast. Please could you let us know if you are struggling with this as we can provide breakfast for any family in need.



Reception Class – Inkpen

We are busy enjoying learning in our fun-packed term discovering all about the Chinese New Year. We have been busy making our own dragon boats using re-cycled materials and junk modelling, carefully thinking about what would be best to use when we trial them in water for our races. We followed this up with writing a set of instructions, using 'bossy words' and even some time connectives!

In maths, we have been focusing on numbers 6, 7 and 8 looking carefully at how these quantities could be represented. We have been searching for mini-beasts and counting the number of legs each one has. We have been recording '+ number sentences too. We read the Chinese story of the animals and ordered each of the animals, using ordinal numbers to describe their position in the race that the Jade Emperor held to measure time.



Class 2 – Ahlberg


Class 2 have had a wonderful return to school and have been putting into practise so many of the skills we learned before Christmas.


Class 3 - Jamila
