Phonics in Year 2

In Year 2 we will continue to practise and revisit sounds from Set 1, 2 and 3 learned in Reception and Year 1. Some children in Year 2 will continue to receive daily phonics lessons in order to consolidate their early reading skills.

When your child is decoding fluently and reading with pace and confidence, our reading emphasis shifts from phonics to comprehension skills.

However, our phonics work continues to play a central role in moving the children's learning forward as we need all the phonics skills the children have learned in Reception and Year 1 to read longer, multisyllabic words such as 'caterpillar' and 'toothbrush,' and to choose the correct sounds for spelling: lighk, liek or like?

Alongside consolidating these crucial phonics sounds for both reading and spelling, there are further spelling patterns to be learned and applied in Year 2. Please see the list below as an example or visit:
