Year 6: Autumn 1

Computing

Focus: Coding and online safety.
Children will learn how to create programs using repeats, timers, if statements and variables. They will use the coding skills that they have encountered to develop their own program. The children will look at the benefits and risks of mobile devices.



Music

Focus: Happy by Pharrell Williams

Children will learn what the musical indicators are for this style of music (pop with soul undertones) and they will appraise a range of songs from this genre. They will build upon their knowledge of musical vocabulary and improvise and compose using glockenspiels.

Focus: Don't forget to let love in

Mathematics

Key Facts: Timetable and division facts individual to each child.
3 minute challenge on varied topics

Place value:

Children will understand numbers up to 10million, compare and order numbers, round numbers to 10, 100, 1000 and negative numbers.

Operations:

Children will understand how to add and subtract whole numbers up to 7 digits and solve problems using these, including missing box problems. They will use short and long multiplication and division to solve calculations and word problems.

Science

Focus: Biology - Living things and their habitats.

Children will know that all living things can be formally grouped according to characteristics and that the standard method for classifying living things is the Linnaean System devised by Carl Linnaeus. They will know that micro-organisms are minute living things which can be helpful or harmful and can be found all around us.

Working Scientifically: Children will develop their skills of asking relevant questions, researching using secondary sources, setting up a fair test, reporting findings and drawing conclusions.

RE

Focus: What does it mean for a Muslim to follow God?

Children will learn the ways in which Muslims follow and submit to God, by examining in detail how the five pillars of Islam guide them through the journey of life. They will consider the impact of these beliefs and worship on Muslims and make connections with how this affects Muslims and people that are not Muslim today.

French

Focus: Le week-end

Children will understand the main points and simple opinions in a spoken story, song or passage about what they do at the weekend. They will read and understand the main points and some detail from a short written passage and match sound to sentences and paragraphs. They will progress on to writing sentences on this topic using a model.

English

Key Text: Oliver

Purpose for writing: Diary Narrative

Writing: Children will be exploring the structure and features of a diary entry and writing their own, linked to our history 'crime and punishment' topic. They will focus particularly on sentence structure and using a variety of clauses in different positions.

Children will learn how to create contrasting characters using action and description, exploring this through drama linked to Oliver. They will further develop their use of clauses and speech punctuation to emphasise the personalities.

Grammar:

- Grammar word class revision (nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, prepositions, subordinating conjunctions, coordinating conjunctions)
- Clause types-main and subordinate
- Phrases

Reading Detectives-Comprehension:

The Lost Happy Endings/ Oliver – visualisation, wonderings, connections, retrieval, deduction, inference, prediction, and language exploration

History

Focus: Crime and punishment through the ages

Children will take a journey back in time starting at the Anglo-Saxon period, followed by exploring the Tudor, Stuart and Victorian ages up to the modern day. They will find out about the crimes of the time and how they were dealt with using primary and secondary sources. They will develop their evaluation of sources and create historical questions, based on the information available to them.

Art

Focus: Drawing-perspective. Painting-atmosphere
Artist Study: Lowry-crime related landscapes

Children will explore the style of Lowry and use perspective to create scenes of a similar style, considering the atmosphere that is added during the stage of painting.
