High priority is given to ensure that disadvantaged children access a broad and balanced curriculum with a particular focus on ensuring they have the reading skills needed to succeed in learning.

Evidence also consistently shows the positive impact that targeted support can have for individual children across the spectrum of achievement. At Braunston we provide targeted academic and nurtured support which is continually assessed, planned, actioned and reviewed.

At Braunston we recognise that there are also sometimes non-academic barriers to success in school. These include attendance, behaviour and social and emotional support. We work hard to provide strategies of support to children and their families to overcome these barriers.
